WHY: Announce the launch of the Co-response Community Outreach

(CoRe) initiative. CoRe contracts an Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN) clinician to work within municipal police departments from Auburn Hills, Birmingham, and Bloomfield Township when responding to calls for crisis intervention involving people experiencing a behavioral health crisis. These three communities are collaborating to fund the OCHN position, supported in part by a grant from the Community Foundation of Southeast

Michigan.

This co-responder program is one element of a broader and comprehensive crisis intervention strategy that also includes the implementation of a robust, county-wide Crisis Intervention Team

(CIT) training program.
