## **Update re: Deceased Individual Found on Train Tracks in Birmingham**

BIRMINGHAM, MI. September 26, 2022 – On Saturday, September 24, 2022 at approximately 9:17 a.m., officers were dispatched to the train tracks near the Derby Bridge in Birmingham on a report of an individual being struck by a southbound train. Officers located a deceased individual on the tracks.

The Birmingham Police Department, the Canadian National Railroad Police Department and the Oakland County Medical Examiner's Office all responded to the scene and assisted with the investigation. At this time, the deceased male has been identified as a 17-year-old Beverly Hills resident. The cause of death is currently being listed as a suicide pending toxicology test results.

As one of the leading causes of death in the United States, suicide affects all ages and types of people. With an increase in awareness and in resources, prevention efforts have become more common and effective.
